<u>STATEMENT BY MAYOR SABOSIK</u>: Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. A. WORKSHOP

1. Committee Reports

Council Member Thulen stated the following: "I do not have much this evening. The people on the Zoning and Construction Committee will be seeing an email from me soon on putting together a meeting to finish up a couple of items from last year."

Council Member Furmato stated the following: "Tomorrow night we have a DPW meeting where we will discuss the schedules for paving and milling for 2018. Also the boat ramp on Bay Avenue is just about complete. It looks like we have to wait for some paving to be done.

Also, I would like to congratulate Pam and John and all the professionals that are back with us."

Council Member Snyder stated the following: "First, we had the pleasure of attending the Firemen's Ball and it was a wonderful event. I just want to remind all the residents that we have a volunteer Fire Department. These volunteers are not paid and I have no doubt that if anybody is interested in volunteering and becoming a Fireman, they would be more than happy to show you what is involved and would welcome you as a volunteer.

The Environmental Commission had their first meeting of 2018 on Monday. It was basically just a reorganizational meeting and they are looking forward to Earth Day in just a couple months."

Council Member Wisniewski stated the following: "We have an Open Space Meeting tomorrow night and I am anxiously waiting for the budget to review."

Council President Borowsky stated the following: "First and foremost I would like to thank Councilman Wisniewski for the great job he did last year as Council President. I have some pretty big shoes to fill and I will work my hardest to do the best I can.

Last Friday we had a preconstruction meeting on Heritage Park, the park with no boundaries project that is coming this Spring. In attendance were members of the Engineering firm CME, Bob Forsyth, Sheri Silversmith, Borough Administrator Frank Pannucci, Councilmember John Wisniewski, myself and representatives from V&K Construction. Hopefully if all goes well and the weather permits, this project will be started sometime in mid-March. It is very exciting and the way time is flying it will be here before you know it. Hopefully the weather permits and kids could be playing in it by the end of April.

The date has been set for this year's Easter egg hunt. It will be Saturday, March 24th at 11am at the Community Park. Also, Sheri informed me today that she is currently working on the Spring programs and the Summer Camp.

One last thing, it is Beach Week. This coming Friday is our annual Beach vs Boro Wrestling match. Both teams are heading into this match undefeated. The Borough is currently ranked number 5 in the Shore and number 24 in the State by Wrestling Circle. If you plan on attending I suggest you get there very early. You might want to consider leaving the kids at home, this is going to get ugly."

2. Report of Mayor

Mayor Sabosik stated the following: "Councilwoman DePaola is not here this evening. She has a family emergency and I hope you keep her family in your prayers. So I will be taking over her spot.

One of the things I always stress is how great this town is. From volunteers to organizations who donate money to different entities. And of course, our Police Department. We have received three different letters from citizens. One is for Sergeant Woit who helped a gentleman who fell and couldn't get up. Sgt. Woit shoveled a path to the house to get in and help. The gentleman said his actions went above and beyond. The second gentleman was Loren MacIver. He also helped a man who fell. He performed first aid on the man until our First Aid Volunteers came. Once again, above and beyond. And the third one, is the most difficult one to talk about. One of our officers, Officer Ippolito was in Hazlet, NJ off duty. He saw a car hit somebody on a motorcycle. The man on the motorcycle was taking his bike to get serviced and his wife was following two cars behind him. When the man got hit, he fell over the bike and had severe head trauma. Officer Ippolito maintained his neck position to stabilize his head and neck for the man. The man was airlifted to Robert Wood Johnson Hospital with a broken cervical spine. The surgeon told the man's wife that the off duty police officer saved your husband from being paralyzed and very well saved his life. So, once again, it shows the quality and the performance that our officers do both on and off duty. I congratulate all of them."

Council President Borowsky opened the meeting to the public

<u>Dennis Vitkauskis</u>: 2117 Foster Road – Stated that Public Works did an excellent job plowing the streets but we have a lot of residents and businesses who plow their properties and put the snow back in the road. He asked Council if there is anything that could be done about that.

<u>Mr. Pannucci</u>: Replied that in the Borough Ordinance everybody is supposed to take care of their properties but with this last storm, there was 18 inches of snow. It was a little harder to get rid of.

<u>Mayor Sabosik</u>: Stated that the Borough will send a letter to those that did not comply with the ordinance to explain to them what our ordinance states. But also reminded the residents that this was the biggest snowfall in one day, in that amount of time, probably in 40 years in this town."

<u>Dennis Vitkauskis</u>: Asked if the water tower that was painted was getting another cell tower lease.

Mr. Dasti: Stated that yes they are in negotiations for another lease agreement but that most of the equipment is already up there because there is an existing lease so they just have to boost up the technology.

<u>Mayor Sabosik</u>: Stated that they Mayor and Council are awaiting a final decision on the financial remuneration that this town will receive from the rental.

Mr. Dasti: Stated that the council has already agreed upon the \$40,000.00 a year, but we just need to finalize the terms of the lease agreement.
