<u>STATEMENT BY MAYOR SABOSIK</u>: Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. Notice of this meeting of the Governing Body has been posted in the corridor of the Municipal Building, published in the January 7, 2022, edition of *The Ocean Star* and January 7, 2022, edition of *The Asbury Park Press*.

Mayor Sabosik stated the following: "Tonight, I have the honor of saying thank you to a great individual and organization, Friends of Solo Foundation. For people who do not know what this foundation is, their mission is to protect K-9s before, during and after their job by providing them with the equipment necessary for their safety. And as you see, our two officers to the left, one a two-legged and one a four-legged, are both protected."

James Waiter spoke and thanked the Mayor and Council for all they have done for K-9 units.

B. WORKSHOP

1. Committee Reports

Council Member Furmato stated the following: "At this time I do not have a committee report, but I do want to take a moment of silence for the people of Ukraine and all they are going through. This should not be happening in 2022. I want all of us to please give a moment of silence. Thank you."

Council Member Wisniewski stated the following: "We have a Finance meeting set up for tomorrow and we are going to go through our first run through of the Municipal Budget. We will be discussing water and sewer and the overall municipal budget at 5:30pm tomorrow night."

Council Member Coulson stated the following: "We have one Land Use ordinance on tonight's agenda and that is amending the affordable housing parameters. The Committee is also finalizing some variance ordinances adjusting several of the variances that we plan to introduce at the next council meeting."

Council Member DePaola stated the following: "First off, I would like to again, extend my thanks to Mr. Waiter and his foundation, Friends of Solo. I was fortunate enough to be able to meet him during the Fall Festival and found him to be quite engaging and believed in his mission. It just shows how one person can truly make a difference.

The Point Pleasant Borough School district is planning the second strategic plan meeting with the members of the community to discuss various challenges throughout the school districts. The meeting is on Wednesday, March 2nd at 6:00pm. It is for visioning strengths and challenges, so hopefully there will be a lot of participants their to have input into the school process. I want to thank Councilman Borowsky for being our Liaison to the school board."

Council Member Borowsky stated the following: "Pre-school registration starts Wednesday at 10am for current students enrolled in preschool now, and at 1pm for all other Borough residents. Our Spring registration brochure will be out tomorrow. Registration for those programs start on March 11th for Borough residents.

This year's Easter Egg hunt is scheduled for April 9th. There are four different age groups, and it will start at 11am.

This Wednesday, March 2nd, The Mayor, our Borough Administrator, Joe Furmato and I are going to have a light meeting with representatives from Colliers Engineering Firm to discuss plans for a new Recreation Center. I will have more information for you at the next meeting. Also, I would like to echo Councilman Furmato's sentiments for Ukraine. To the military there, give them hell. We are pulling for you."

Council President Charlene Archer stated the following: "The Environmental Commission are very active getting ready for Earth Day. This is the first one they have had since 2019 so they are very excited. They are also going to have rides for the kids, vendors, a band at the bandshell and this is all going to be on April 23rd from 12pm to 5pm. The rain date will be April 24th. They also wanted to mention that in May, plastic bags are going to be banned. So they will have information on that new law that is coming into effect."

2. Report of Mayor

Mayor Sabosik stated the following: "This months Mayor's Hours is going to be March 9th from 6pm-7pm. This is for anyone who wishes to come forward to talk about anything they like. There will be other Council Members there and the Town Administrator. This is a friendly venue where you have the opportunity to discuss issues where people might be afraid of crowds or do not want to talk in front of others at a council meeting. This is a very good way for us to connect with each other.

On February 16th, we had a meeting with the Ocean County Mayor's Meeting. We had the NJDLGS director there to speak with us and she talked to us about various grants, including grants for towns who have shared services. We are looking into a possibility on getting some grants from the State. She was a very energized speaker, so it was a pleasure listening.

Another meeting we have coming up on Wednesday at 10am, I will be down in Toms River with the Road Department with a plethora of issues, from speed studies, to traffic, to getting better turn lanes in our town. I will keep you abreast of that at the next meeting. I look forward to a very productive meeting with their representatives and their road department.

Saturday, April 9, 2022, there will be the 37th Annual Spring Beach Cleanup. I will keep you abreast of that information of where and when. It will be 9am-12:30pm.

Going back to the Friends of Solo Foundation. This is really a great foundation. This protects our police dogs. His website is friendsofsolo.org. If anyone knows anyone who can help out, please do. He is a very energized, hard-working individual. As he said tonight, he started with one and is now up to 17 donated vests. I think it shows what one individual can do to create a safe environment for our four-legged officers."
